The exhibition explores the social background, iconography, and visual splendor of Japanese tattoos through the printed media that helped to carry them from the streets of Edo-period Japan to 21st-century tattoo shops all over the world.

Field Trips

Guided tours, led by trained Docents, engage students in close looking and artful thinking with art and gardens throughout the Museum's campus. Students explore, discuss, and document artwork through artful activities they will take back to class.

Virtual Tours
